

Background

- UNC Modification Rules (5.7.1) requires that meetings of the Modification Panel are held in London
 - Unless the Modification Panel determines otherwise
- Rule in place since the establishment of the original Network Code in March 1996
 - Carried forward into the Uniform Network Code in 2005
- Reflected the work locations of the majority of the members of the UNC Modification Panel and other stakeholders in 1996?

Why Change

- Unnecessary constraint on Code Administrator
 - More flexible working arrangements for individuals
 - Wider geographical spread of individuals' work locations
- Greater flexibility in meeting location would allow the Code Administrator to optimise meeting costs

Solution

UNC modified to:

- Remove the requirement for meetings of the Modification Panel to take place in London
- Require that meetings of the Modification Panel take place in the location specified by the Code Administrator
- Ability of Modification Panel to determine otherwise (i.e. that the meeting take place in a location other than that specified by the Code Administrator) retained

Governance

- Proposed for Self Governance
 - unlikely to have a material effect on the UNC governance procedures

'Authority Direction/Self Governance Materiality Guidance' document

Effect on	Likely to require Authority decision if your proposal
UNC governance or modification procedures	 Affects the rights of the industry to be engaged in proposed changes to the UNC. Changes the User or Transporter representation obligations. Changes any Authority decision-making capacity.

 Proposer's view: the proposed changes to the Modification Rules do not affect rights of the industry to be engaged nor change User or Transporter representation obligations

Recommended Steps

- Raised for initial consideration by the Modification Panel on 19th August 2021
- Recommendation to issue to a Workgroup for a period of 2 months for development
 - Workgroup Report to Modification Panel in October 2021
