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Dear Colleague

Thank you for the feedback on the 1<sup>st</sup> Draft 2012 AUGS for 2013/14 the correspondence received has been posted on the Joint Office of Transporters website. As described in our progress update letter published on 4<sup>th</sup> July our efforts have concentrated on the consumption data analysis and revisit of the theft split methodology.

However, we have today completed our responses to the feedback received and these will be published on the Joint Office of Transporters website under AUGS Communications. This also includes responses to the clarification questions raised by British Gas and discussed at the UNCC meeting on 19<sup>th</sup> May which helped clarify certain issues.

Given where we are in terms of the consumption analysis some of the new items raised during the most recent consultation will be looked at once the consumption analysis has progressed further as they may or may not be relevant at that time. Our intention is to discuss these in more detail at the next consultation based UNCC/AUGE meeting.

In addition, we have also provided a presentation for the UNCC meeting on July 19<sup>th</sup> to provide a further update on progress and plans going forward although this does not go into the level of technical detail as the 19<sup>th</sup> May meeting as analysis is ongoing in a variety of topics.

There is also a further letter published today requesting data/information from the Shippers/Xoserve regarding estimations of theft and theft periods once detected and customer change dates (please see separate letter for details).
