It was noted that these differences were not considered to be material, however it would be recommended that a modification is raised to ensure Code is consistent with the working processes if they are to be enduring.

It was noted that for Pot 2:

- 138 potential interventions 87 of which were retained as 0, 72 of which in Month 1
- 12 actual consumption obtained from DMSP and inserted by CDSP in Month 1 and 2 1,612
 MWh amended in allocation
- 11 consumptions amended by DMSP in Month 1 & 2 950 MWh

Conclusions:

For the Transitional Issue (Pot 1) Supply Meter Points:

 Benefits seen within one Month following implementation, no further amendments undertaken by CDSP.

For Business Pot 2 Supply Meter Points

- Some intervention undertaken by CDSP 12 instances where DMSP provided Consumption inserted by CDSP, 7 instances where instruction to insert AQ/365 provided – majority in Month 1 (10, 5 respectively)
- Intervention by DMSP in 17 instances to amend estimated zero consumption across Pot 1 and

The Workgroup agreed that there appeared to have been a transitional benefit supporting the implementation of Modification 0634 (Urgent). However, the industry has moved into a business as usual mode and that further benefits appear to be unlikely which would support the removal of the process from Code.

The Workgroup believe it would be beneficial to remove the obligations on the CDSP to manage this process as it is inconsistent with the principles adopted on the implementation of Modification 0565A - Central Data Service Provider: General framework and obligations and the removal of the use of the CDSP discretion in the provision of services.

3 Terms of Reference
