We recognise that this modification proposal has been raised as a result of the implementation of the European CAM network code, allied to decisions made by DECC, to standardise and align the gas day across Europe. We regard this proposal as necessary in order for GB and National Grid to ensure compliance with the revised gas day timing of 05:00 – 05:00. Nevertheless, we note ongoing discussions about the extent to which the GB upstream production industry may be required to change its mode of operations in order to align with the proposed onshore gas day, even though such a change is not required by the aforesaid Code. It is possible that there will be significant costs associated with this. We believe that this upstream aspect may not have been given due consideration at the time the CAM network code was being developed and agreed.
